



The cowl swoosh and wheel pants design are signature elements in the paint schemes found on Waco Aircraft, originally built in Troy, OH



Friendship Flyer is named after the Mercury spacecraft of John Glenn, who was born in Cambridge, OH and became the first American to orbit the Earth. *Flyer* is the name given by the Wrights to their first airplanes. The font replicates the lettering used on Glenn's capsule.

The side striping suggests the pattern and captures the unique shape of the state flag of Ohio.



Cessna's standard logo denoting the 182 model is incorporated into the design for the vertical stabilizer.

The nose arrow evokes the *Spirit of Columbus* in which Geraldine Mock, from Columbus, OH became the first women to fly around the world.

The distinctive red wings of the original Ohio Highway Patrol paint scheme for N116HR is retained with the bold arrow along its side now suggested in blue.

The logo pays homage to WWI ace, Eddie Rickenbacker, who was born and raised in Columbus, OH. The twin hats celebrate the Wright Brothers of Dayton, OH and the footprint recognizes Wapakoneta, OH native, Neil Armstrong's first step on the moon.

The vintage Skylane logo recognizes the heritage of the Cessna Aircraft Company
